Studio Art Lecturer Pool *Revised*

The [Art Department](#) at the University of California, Santa Cruz invites applications for an on-going pool of qualified temporary instructors to teach studio art courses either full or part-time. The campus operates on a schedule of three 11-week academic quarters per year. The University of California is committed to equal opportunity and affirmative action employment. The campus is especially interested in candidates who can contribute to the diversity and excellence of the academic community through their research, teaching and/or service.

Outstanding candidates with experience in teaching in the following areas are encouraged to apply: drawing/painting, printmaking, sculpture, photography, electronic art, two- and three-dimensional intermedia, theory and criticism. Candidates must have full knowledge of concepts, processes, materials, and techniques as needed in studio courses.

ELECTRONIC ART - The department offers project-based courses in digital media, hyper-media, collaborative networks, computer-based installation, and interface design for virtual communities. Courses to be taught include all levels of electronic art and special topics in interactive technologies. Knowledge of Macintosh and SGI environments required.

DRAWING/PAINTING - Courses to be taught include: introductory, intermediate and advanced drawing and painting.

PHOTOGRAPHY - Courses to be taught include: introductory, intermediate and advanced, color, and digital photography.

PRINTMAKING - Courses to be taught include: introductory, intermediate and advanced intaglio/relief and lithography (plate and stone); book arts; and digital printmaking.

SCULPTURE - Courses to be taught include: introductory, intermediate and advanced courses in figure sculpture, bronze casting, metal fabrication, material metaphor and three-dimensional intermedia.

THEORY AND CRITICISM IN THE ARTS - Candidates must be able to teach any or all of the following: Introduction to the Visual Arts, Topics in Contemporary Art (Feminism and Visual Art, Ethno-American Art), Visual Media: Issues of Theory and Practice (Junior, Senior), Introduction to Gallery Management, and Practicum for Careers in Art.

TWO-DIMENSIONAL INTERMEDIA - Courses to be taught include: introductory, intermediate and advanced two-dimensional intermedia.

RANK: Lecturer

SALARY: \$5,417 - \$6,765 per course, commensurate with qualifications and experience.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS: M.F.A. and/or college level teaching experience, and demonstrated competence in the field; evidence of a continuing professional practice. A strong and active exhibition or publishing record in significant venues would be considered partial evidence of competence in the field.
