ON-GOING LECTURER POOL

[Porter College](#), one of the ten undergraduate, liberal arts colleges at the University of California, Santa Cruz, is establishing a pool of candidates to teach sections of its Core Course and a few other courses at an upper- or lower-division level that focus on the arts in a multicultural society or have a strong interdisciplinary focus.

The Porter College Core Course explores aspects of the college theme: "arts in a multicultural society." The Core Course is a required course for first-year students and is taught primarily in seminars and tutorials. Instructors participate in staff meetings, meet with a seminar of 24 students, assign and read student papers, meet with students in tutorials once per week, prepare narrative evaluations of student performance, and carry out other normal instructional duties. There is a particular responsibility to work with students on writing skills. Appointments to teach in the core course are for Fall quarter only.

Porter College also offers occasional 2-unit courses that focus on the Arts in American ethnic groups with either a studio or theoretical focus. Instructors conversant in artistic traditions of Afro-Americans, Hispanic Americans, Japanese-Americans, Filipinos, Chinese, and Pacific Islanders are especially encouraged to apply.

Occasional 2-unit courses are offered in interdisciplinary arts. Individuals who can teach course work that spans two or more specific disciplines: graphic design and printing, music and theater, vaudeville and dance, sociology and art history, art, language, poetry, drawing, film and historical sources, etc. are encouraged to apply. Instructors with formal training in women's studies or gay/lesbian/ bisexual/transgender studies, and in the relationships of these studies to the arts are strongly encouraged to apply. These interdisciplinary courses may focus on either theory or practice.

If a candidate selected to the pool has additional areas of expertise, another campus unit may approach the candidate to teach in that area of expertise.

RANK: Lecturer

SALARY: Commensurate with qualifications and experience, (approximately \$4,484 - \$5,025 per 5-unit course) (or \$1,794 - \$2,010 per 2-unit course)

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS: M.A. or equivalent experience or college-level teaching experience, preferably at the freshman level. Experience in teaching college core course or facilitating student discussion around issues of academic and intellectual life of the university preferred.

For interdisciplinary arts courses, evidence of expertise via professional participation in the art, is desirable. For Academic Success and Leadership courses, experience in teaching similar courses or academic training in these areas is sought.
