Qualified candidates who can contribute to the diversity and excellence of the Film & Digital Media program are encouraged to apply.

RANK: Lecturer

SALARY: \$5,259 to \$5,950 per 5-unit course, commensurate with qualifications and experience. The campus operates on a schedule of three 11-week quarters per academic year. A full time appointment is based upon an eight course equivalency.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS: Ph.D. in a relevant field of study or equivalent professional experience. Demonstrated potential for excellence in innovative research and for university teaching. University teaching experience preferred.

POSITION AVAILABLE: As openings occur, contingent upon need and availability of funding.
